STATEMENT HEAVY METALS RoHS LF 140 series


The directive on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment 2011/65/EC; commonly referred to as the Restriction of Hazardous Substances Directive or RoHS). The RoHS is an European regulation of 8 June 2011, and is required to be enforced and become law in each member state. This directive restricts the use of six hazardous materials in the manufacture of various types of electronic and electrical equipment.

According to our present information, the LF 140 ink series have less than the RoHS limits for the six restricted use substances (Lead, Cadmium, Mercury, Hexavalent Chromium, PBB and PBDE). Only minute traces of heavy metals in certain pigments can be in place.

Conclusion:

LF 140 Ink in the cartridges is in compliance with the RoHS directive.
